Quarterly Report  
March 19, 1991

New Members:

The Council would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to the Membership Roll. Your applications have been examined and put in folders with documentation tracing back to your ancestors. Each individual has been assigned an enrollment number which is available upon request.

You are receiving this quarterly report in recognition of your membership, a report distributed to all members. The tribe requests an annual \$10.00 donation of all families. The donation places your family's name on the tribal mailing list for one year. Contributions insure operational soundness and provide monies for the expenses incurred in the process to gain Federal recognition. There were approximately 320 names added to the Rolls in 1991. Another group will be added in June. After a re-evaluation, the Elisabeth M. Hammer family has been recognized.

Addresses:

We wish to remind you to provide us with your current address. Many people have moved in the last five years and we cannot locate them. If you know of any family members who have changed their addresses, please provide us with the information.

A.N.A. - Administration of Native Americans:

We are waiting the results of a new Grant which was submitted on February 15, 1991. This is the third time the Grant has been rewritten and presented for approval. Receiving this Grant is very important in our legislative action to receive recognition.

Scholarships:

Finances:

We continue to need financial support in our struggle to gain Federal recognition. Additional monies will be necessary as we move into the final phase of this process. Your \$10.00 donations are gratefully appreciated.

May Elections:

Elections will be held on May 18, 1991 at the Fond du Lac Labor Hall on Bank Street. The ballot includes the following: Chairperson - 3-year term, Tribal Secretary - 3-year term, and three Council persons for 2-year terms. Qualified voters must be enrolled members at least 18 yrs. of age. Those unable to attend the meeting can vote by absentee ballot. Individual requests for absentee ballots can be obtained from Bonnie Hauman, P.O. Box 34, Leopold, WI 54948. Request only a ballot for yourself. The request must include a self-addressed stamped envelope mailed on or before May 4, 1991.

Absentee Ballot Procedure:

1. Mark your choices and place the ballot in a plain sealed envelope.
2. Place the envelope in a mailing envelope which includes your return address. Mail to the Tribal Secretary.

The Administration for Native Americans has awarded a grant to the Corporation of the Tribe to help in the goal of becoming re-recognized. The money will help to put forth our story and reach our goal with the help of Native American Rights Fund (NARF) and Dr. Campisi.

The brief history of the tribe is now put together in a story form. One of our goals at this time is to make this brief history available to each member, especially in Wisconsin and the surrounding states, to be able to talk intelligently to our legislative members and others who can help us in our endeavors. To help in our legislative attempt to become re-recognized. No one, but no one, should be out telling about the Brothertown Indians to any group, large or small, unless they receive the Council approval and have the brief history of the tribe. Some information thought to be true, have changed and all the facts that we have at this time have been documented. If you are asked to speak to a group about the Brothertowns, please help us to put forth the correct story and give the Council the courtesy of getting their approval. Remember, we must all work together towards our final goal, that of becoming re-recognized.

A Committee was created as a steering committee by the Tribal Council on February 22, 1991 with the following mission.

1. To organize members of the Tribe for the purpose of communicating Tribal history, facts, and objectives.
2. To use this tribal organization to explore the rights and privileges wanted by members when the tribe is treated as a sub-part fo the federal government.
3. To use this tribal organization to establish a positive network in support of federal restoration legislation.
4. To seek restoration legislation from the federal Congress for the Brothertown Indian Nation.

The first objective of this committee shall be to provide all tribal members with facts concerning tribal history and current tribal members (The Roll). To do this several meetings shall be held around the State this year. Do you want to serve on this committee? What is needed now are volunteers.

Volunteers are needed to host one of these meetings. Can you host such a meeting? We would like to hold 5-8 such meetings. What is needed is an all weather place (at least a roof) to hold a meeting for 10 to 20 members of the Tribe.

Volunteers are needed to contact tribal members, once the meeting date and place is established. We want to encourage all members to attend one of these meetings to find out more about the Brothertown Indian Nation.

Labor Day has come giving us the message that summer is over and the fall season is upon us. We hope you all had a fun filled summer and are looking forward to the fall season.

Our July picnic was huge success. Every one who attended had a great time and said they are looking forward to next year. Irene Shady and Mabel Pownell and families did another outstanding job of planning and carrying out the plan. Thank you all for your time and talents. It is greatly appreciated. And the food was unbelievable.

The annual administration donation of \$10 per family for the year will be due again January 1.
